2. At the outset, the chairman extended his greetings and welcomed the representative from various PGAs and other stakeholders.

- 3. With the permission of Chair, Shri Vikram D. Phadke, Joint Commissioner of Customs (Import-I) informed that **no new agenda point** has been received for this PTFC meeting.
- 4. However, Shri Vikram D. Phadke, Joint Commissioner of Customs (Import-I), informed the Committee that the issue relating to the posting of Import Docks Officers at Indira Docks, as raised in the previous PTFC meeting, has been examined. He clarified that the MOD primarily handles containers carrying miscellaneous goods, whereas Indira Dock predominantly manages oversized cargo such as machinery (both new and used), vehicles, and coils. Containers transshipped from Nhava Sheva are routed to the MOD, as the examination of containers containing miscellaneous goods is considerably more time-consuming than the inspection of cargo typically processed at Indira Dock. Consequently, more time is required at the MOD for the examination of goods, particularly when container movements are frequent and regular. In view of the above, operational activities are more feasible and efficiently conducted from the MOD than from Indira Dock.

As there was no further point of discussion the meeting concluded with a vote of thanks to chair.
